Event Rejection Policy

Entries close at 12 noon on Thursday 14th August. Entries are capped at ~200 events each day and entries may be suspended/closed early if oversubscribed.

The Regatta Committee reserves the right to amend, update, merge or reject entries for the benefit, safety and wellbeing of all competitors and smooth-running of Ross Regatta 2025. In case of prevailing low water levels, the Committee reserves the right to amend the course, change permissible entries, or cancel the event, in order to ensure safe and fair competition.

Event Rejection

Whilst the Committee will do their best to accommodate all competitors, entries may be rejected or amended if, for example:

- There is no opposition for an event
- The race is a straight final where crews have a large differential in CRI ranking.
- We are trying to prioritise the maximum number of entries per race, should the regatta be oversubscribed we may reject smaller boats first (i.e. singles).
- We will operate a substitution/reserves list: please let us know if you wish to be added to this.

Masters Racing

Only two age categories will be combined if required to create opposition e.g. Masters C/D, Masters F/G. The committee will organise Masters' racing using the handicap system.

CRI Ranking

Where possible, crews' CRI ranking will be taken into consideration in order to create fair and equal opposition.

Refunds

Should the Regatta be cancelled, a full refund will be given. If a crew is rejected by the Organising Committee a refund of entry fees will be given. If a crew scratches a refund may be given, depending on the circumstances.
