NOTES: Ross Regatta 2026 – Child & Vulnerable Adult Welfare

The Organising Committee of Ross Regatta 2026 places the highest importance on the welfare and wellbeing of all children and vulnerable adults.

Club Responsibility

- Any club entering junior athletes (including coxes) or vulnerable adults must provide the name and telephone number of at least one club representative responsible for

them.

- These details will be requested at registration and used only for this purpose. They will not be stored.
- To save time on the day, clubs can download the form from the website, complete it, and bring it to Crew Registration.

Reporting Concerns

- All suspicions, concerns, or allegations of harm or wrongdoing will be taken seriously.
- Report them immediately to a Regatta Official or Ross Rowing Club (RRC) member.
- Concerns will be handled in line with the Child Welfare Plan.
- The Ross Rowing Club Welfare Officer is available via Registration.

Supervision

- Ross Rowing Club is **not responsible** for supervising anyone camping at the event. The campsite is a public area, and emergency services or local authorities should be contacted if necessary.
- Clubs are responsible for ensuring their members are appropriately supervised at all times.

Behaviour

- Any unacceptable behaviour reported to the Organising Committee may result in athletes, crews, or clubs being removed from the event, regardless of actions taken by external authorities.

First Aid & Emergencies

- First Aid assistance can be requested from any Marshall or Umpire.
- For emergencies, dial **999** or **112**.
- A defibrillator is available at the Ross Rowing Club Boathouse.
